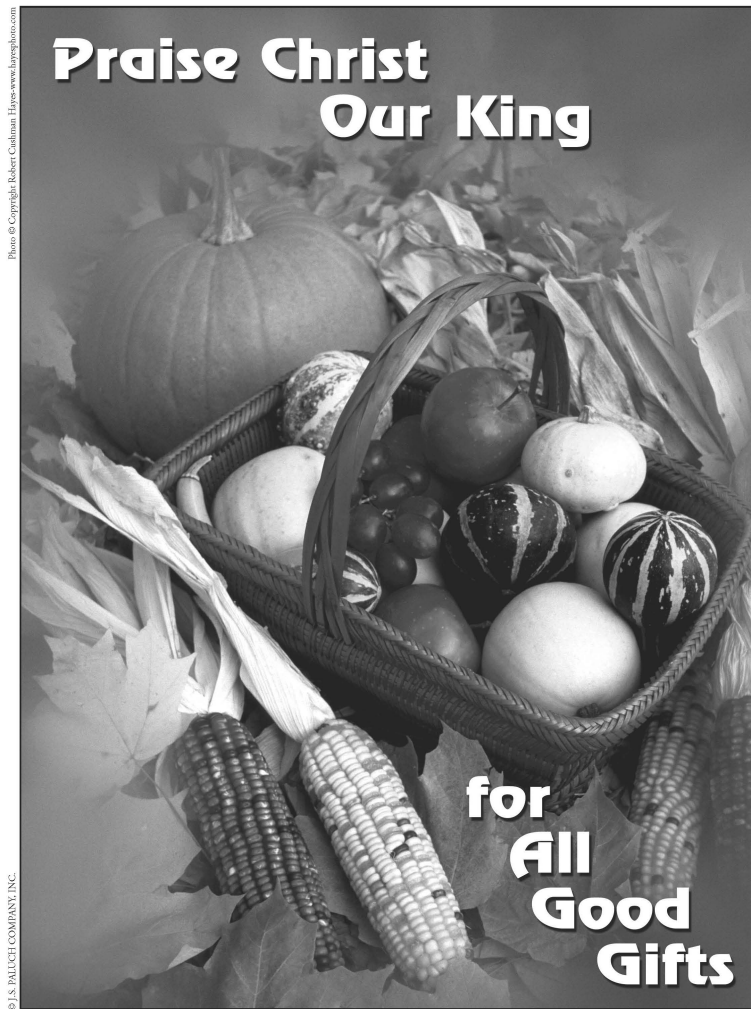

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

Please keep in mind the Children's Education Initiative which is designed to raise money for both public and private schools. In order to get the Children's Education Initiative (CEI) on the ballot for November, 2014, the State requires 250,000 signatures.

There are a number of advantages for supporting this initiative:

1. The measure would not raise taxes or reduce aid to public schools.
2. 50 percent of the funds would go toward improving programs in public schools, 40 percent would provide scholarships for private schools, and 10 percent would be used to enhance special education programs for children with special needs.
3. Any person donating to an educational foundation would be given a State income tax credit of 50% of the dollar amount donated.

The Children's Education Initiative, if enacted, would go a long way to providing scholarships to families who have children in Catholic schools and to families who have children with special needs. Therefore, it is strongly supported by our Archbishop. Having spent many years in both public and private education, as a teacher and administrator, I also strongly support this plan. It is a significant way to support all of education (K-12) in the State of Missouri, without an additional tax burden.

Petitions will be available in the back of church over the next several weekends. I strongly urge each of you to sign the petition at your convenience after Mass. Let us help put this Initiative on next November's ballot. Every signature counts. Please do not pass up this opportunity to help support the education of every child in the State of Missouri.

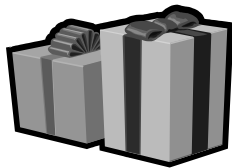

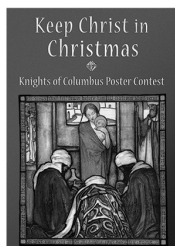

**Keep Christ in Christmas
Poster Contest**

In a society where Christmas has become for many - especially children - a secular holiday. To combat this, the Knights of Columbus Council # 453 has introduced the Keep Christ in Christmas poster contest. This program will allow young people to engage their creative talents and imaginations while understanding the true, spiritual meaning of Christmas and that their artwork will bring others to remember Christ in Christmas.

Entries in the Knights of Columbus “Keep Christ in Christmas” Poster contest must include a slogan reflecting the topic and an original visual image.

Eligibility

The Knights of Columbus “Keep Christ in Christmas” Poster Contest is open to all young people between the ages of 5 and 14.

Age Groups

Contest entrants compete in one of three age groups—ages 5 through 7, ages 8 through 10, and 11 through 14 with **6 winning entries – first, and second place winners in each age group.**

Criteria :

- Each poster should be the original work (including concept, layout, slogan and any visual images)
- Poster must be 11X17 inches in size. If pastels, chalk or charcoal are used the poster must be laminated or covered with clear plastic.
- Each poster must be submitted with the Knights of Columbus “Keep Christ in Christmas” Poster contest entry form available from Joe Miklovic, Youth Director—353-1062. The name and age of the entrant should be printed on the reverse side of the poster in case the poster and entry form get separated.
- All entries become property of the Knights of Columbus Supreme Council. Posters will not be returned.

SAINT OF THE WEEK

ST. CLEMENT I,

Pope and Martyr

Little is known of this apostolic father beyond a few facts. He was a disciple of St. Peter, and perhaps of St. Paul. It is thought that

Clement was bishop of Rome. But there is great difficulty in admitting this supposition.

According to Tertullian, Clement succeeded St. Peter immediately in the episcopal government of the Church at Rome. But in the list of bishops given us by Irenaeus and Eusebius he occupies the third place after the apostle, that is, after Linus and Cletus. (Peter, Linus, Cletus, Clement, Sixtus... etc.). This is all that we know of St. Clement.

The legend of the martyrdom of St. Clement relates that, in the reign of the Emperor, Trajan, a sedition arose among the rabble of Rome against the Christians, and especially against Clement, bishop of Rome. Mamertinus, Prefect of Rome, interfered to put down the riot, and having arrested Clement, sent him to the emperor, who ordered his banishment to Pontus, where he was condemned to work in the marble quarries.

He found many Christians among his fellow-convicts, and comforted and encouraged them. The only spring of drinking water was six miles off, and it was a great hardship to the convicts to have to fetch it all from such a distance. One day Clement saw a lamb scraping at the soil with one of its forefeet. He took it as a sign that water was there; dug, and found a spring.

As Clement succeeded in converting many pagans, he was sent to the prefect, who ordered him to be drowned in the sea with an old anchor attached to his neck. His body was recovered by his disciple Phoebus. The relics of St. Clement were transferred to Constantinople (860) by St. Cyril. Some of the relics found their way to Rome, and were deposited in the church of San Clemente, where they are still reverently preserved.

In art St. Clement of Rome is represented as a Pope with an anchor at his side. His death is placed at about 100 A.D. Pope St. Clement I is patron of marble workers and his feast day is celebrated on November 23rd.
