

Who we are: The Little Sisters of Mary Immaculate of Gulu (LSMIG) are an indigenous Congregation of Catholic Sisters founded in 1936 in the Archdiocese of Gulu in Northern Uganda (East Africa).

Our Mission: LSMIG are called to witness to the love of Jesus Christ to the most vulnerable, especially women, children, youth and the senior members Sensitization Program Against of the society. We the LSMIG live our Early Marriage mission through Catholic education,

health, pastoral and social services to the poor and the most vulnerable.

Our Ministry: Since 2016, the LSMIG are responding to a unique ministry to a people who are recovering from four decades of civil war (1979-2016), while concurrently dealing with an infux of

refugees from neigboring South Sudan and the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC). The traumatic impact of the war, coupled with the global crisis of COVID 19 and lack of access to vaccines, has generated untold humanitarian crisis in northern Uganda. The COVID 19 lockdown exposed refugee girls and boys to domestic and sexual violence & forced early marriage. The girls in particular are given to early marriage in exchange for money and animals to meet basic needs of the other members of family. Consequently, these girls have become child mothers at the tender age of 13-16 years. Without Catholic health services and education, these girls and their babies are prone to more violence and exploitation.

We invite you through your pastor and parish to kindly consider :


