Hi Everyone,

I was devastated, as we all are, to hear of the shooting at CVPA High School in our parish boundaries on Monday morning. There were numerous police officers here at Magdalen for the funeral of Sgt. Becky Kitchell (Andrews); KMOX said the swift response was due in part to the police presence at Magdalen at the time.

As good as that is, it still doesn't restore the lives of student Alexzandria Bell, aged 15, or teacher Jean Kuczka. And the pain of the students and staff is another untold injury. To say nothing of the greater issues of mental health and gun violence that need to be addressed in our land.

I'm a big "thoughts and prayers" guy, because I believe the Lord hears our prayers and answers them. But I think part of the "thought" is for people of faith to act as well. This happened in our neighborhood, everyone. It's not just something that we can ignore any longer.

When the Uvalde School Shooting happened earlier this year, I wrote letters to our Senators. In return I received very nice acknowledgment letters, but with little teeth. As a leader of a community I feel a certain level of helplessness; what can I do to make sure that a teen learning interpretive dance and a grandmother, mom, teacher who drives 40 miles to teach can do so without being gunned down?

I don't have these answers, but will be asking God to help us understand what we can do. Perhaps if we send letters once more to our representatives, urging them to act, some changes might be made:




The Weekend of November 6, all parishes in the Archdiocese of St. Louis will take up the annual collection for the Retirement Fund for Religious.
