This weekend's Gospel is a good one! We all know "This little light of mine, I'm gonna let it shine." It's a nice one to have stuck in your head, but it's a lot harder to live out.

Jesus' exhortation to be salt and light is compelling. I want to live that way more fully. I want to be a beacon of light to others. We all are to some degree, but I think our tendency is to want to run and hide instead of being a lamp set on a lamp stand.

For instance:

- -Do you say meal prayers in public?
- -Do you pray with your family, even pray over them?
- -Do you talk about your faith with others (small group)?
- -What about accountability: are you challenging others in a healthy criticism? Is there anyone you depend on to challenge you to grow?

I hope I'm not pouring salt in a wound here, but this is what Jesus has called us to be, not bland, half dim Catholics who don't really share the Gospel. And here at Magdalen, there is such a richness, a zest you all have, that can be a great gift to others who don't yet know Jesus!





- Negotiated \$200.00 in Utility Pledges for a neighbor in need.




